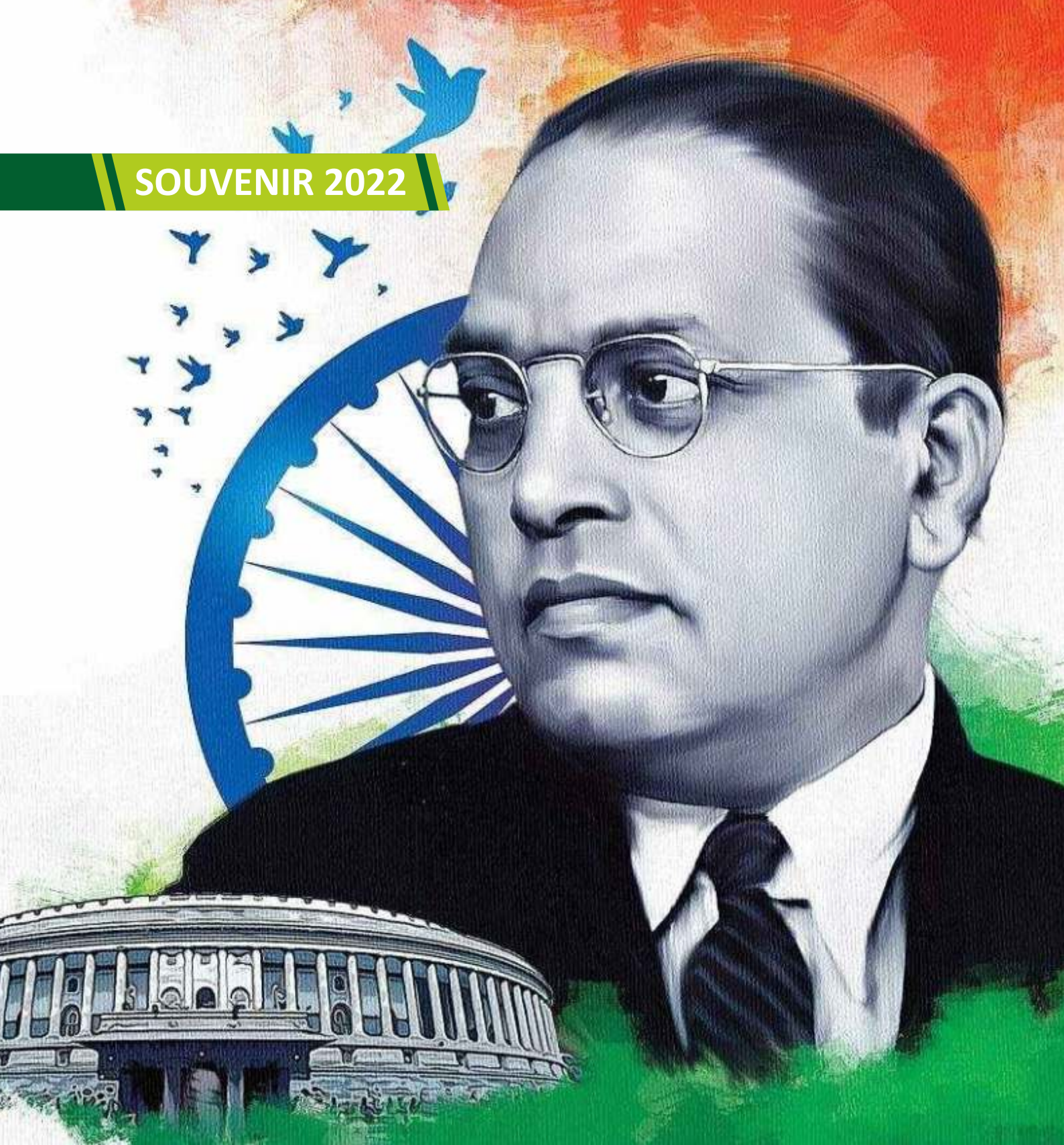

## Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar (The architect of the Indian Constitution)

**‘Constitution is not a mere lawyers' document, it is a vehicle of Life, and its spirit is always the spirit of Age’. — Dr BR Ambedkar**

Dr Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar, the paragon of equality is popularly known as 'the Architect of Indian constitution'. He was born in a Dalit Mahar family on the 14th of April, 1891, to Ramji Maloji Sakpal (Subedar) and Bhimabai Sakpal at Mhow cantonment, where his father was an officer in the Indian Army. Ambedkar completed graduation and post-graduation from Elphinstone College, University of Bombay. Then he studied Economics at Columbia University, New York. He received a Ph D from the London School of Economics. This inspirational Indian icon was a jurist, an economist, a social reformer and a political leader. Ambedkar headed the drafting committee of the Constitution of India.

Dalits have been suppressed and exploited by the upper caste Hindus for the centuries. The 'untouchables' had to face a lot of social, economic and educational discrimination since their birth. Ambedkar was highly disappointed with the hindu hierarchical caste system and he decided to launch a movement against untouchability.

He worked very hard for the upliftment and dignity of the Dalits. He himself was subjected to socio-economic discrimination since his school years because of the practice of untouchability. He organized marches demanding Dalits' right to enter the temples and the right to draw water from the public sources.

Representing Dalits, Ambedkar signed a pact with Madan Mohan Malviya (on behalf of the Hindus). The agreement (popularly called the Poona Pact) gave reserved seats to the depressed classes in the Provisional Legislature within the general electorate.

The Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru, invited Ambedkar to serve as the Chairman of the Drafting Committee of the Constitution for the Republic of India. This draft was deliberated and adopted by the Constituent Assembly as the Indian Constitution. It guarantees protection for individual citizens, including freedom of religion, the abolition of untouchability, and the outlawing of all forms of discrimination.

Ambedkar argued for extensive economic and social rights for women, and won the Constituent Assembly's support for introducing a system of reservation of jobs in the civil services, schools and colleges for members of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes and other backward classes.

He was also called Babasaheb by his supporters.

## Speech by D.S. Bains, IAS (Retd) Chairman DPS Khanna, on the occasion of Senior Founders Day



Dear Parents, Respected Principal, the Headmistress, Teachers, Vice Chairperson, S Manmohan Singh (President FAP, Ludhiana) and dear students,-

It is my proud privilege to welcome Mr NPS Aulakh, IPS, Ex DGP, Punjab Police and former DG of the National Security Guard, the NSG. He is one of the most successful police officers of the country, I am sure the school will gain by his gracious presence on its premises.

Sir, today we are celebrating the XIIth Founder's Day with the pious aim of helping our students achieve their dreams. The school is proud to have sent students to medical and engineering colleges. This year we have a Dipsite from Khanna in IIT Jammu. In sports, we are proud of our golfer prodigy, Yuvraj Hara, the winner of the Junior PGTI (North Zone), who is going to study in Vancouver. Jashanbir Singh Gill went to Buffalo University, New York, aided by his achievements in horse riding. At this juncture we have 16 students pursuing MBBS, 8 students in prominent Engineering Colleges, 55 students in Canada, 3 in Australia, 2 each in the UK & in the USA & one each in China, Ukraine & Germany. This year we will start an alumni Association of Khanna Dipsites.

How are these children making brilliant careers? They are doing it by paying attention to the topic being taught in class. They go home and revise. They also do their homework by their own effort and if they have any difficulty, they ask the teacher concerned. Most of all, they don't waste time in going for tuitions. Tuitions don't leave enough time for the students to master their syllabus. At DPS Khanna our teachers take extra classes for students who need help. This year we will start extra classes for the brilliant students too. Not only will this save time of the students, it will save money of the parents too.

DPSK has started a career Counseling Cell which will first map out the aptitude of the students in Class X and guide them in their career choices. We encourage the students to choose the career stream which gives them most pleasure as they are sure to excel in the area that they enjoy working in. Our students have a choice to take up hospitality, careers in the merchant navy, dance drama and acting, architecture, accounting, journalism etc besides of course in medicine, engineering, army or civil services. Dipsites have a choice of studying in India or overseas. The best of colleges and professional institutions (and their number is not large) always have a deluge of aspirants. Consequently the success rate is low.

So many bright and hard working students look for avenues of higher education overseas. Many complaints



are being received of dubious institutions that fleece gullible students. The Principal got information the other day that a Dipsite is now languishing in a Canadian College, which is located on one floor of a building. Parents are well advised to check up the credentials of the institution and the value of the course before they send their wards overseas.

On the 3rd of December, the school will host an Overseas University Fair. Confirmation has come from 5 universities- 2 in Canada, 2 in Australia and one university from the UK will send their representatives to guide our students and parents about the courses that are available, the living arrangements that are available & the cost of the education. These Universities are:

- Huron
- Western International (near Toronto)
- Monash (Melbourne)
- The University of New Castle (near Sydney)
- The University of St Andrews, UK

As a part of the teaching learning process, this year the students are staging a Theatre production on Babasaheb Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar, who was perhaps the most literate of the leaders in India's freedom struggle. His educational qualifications are an MA, M Sc, PhD, D Litt & Bar at law. A recent book by Mr Sashi Tharoor MP, titled 'Ambedkar A Life', underlines that and I quote 'Ambedkar is today among the most revered of Indians, his statues across the country second only in number to those of Mahatma Gandhi. He even overtook Gandhi in the recent poll to determine the 'greatest Indian' of modern times, in which over 20 million votes were cast. All the major political parties vie with one another to claim him as their own. To the Dalit, he is a revered figure who was chiefly responsible for outlawing untouchability and fighting to give dignity to the community. And most of all, he is hailed as the father of India's constitution, the principle reason why India continues to remain a democracy'. I am sure the achievements of the underprivileged boy who fought throughout for a life of dignity of 20% Indians will inspire us all.

I would like to end my speech with the hope that all of us continue to uphold the liberal, secular and plural values in our nation.

## Speech by D.S. Bains, IAS (Retd) Chairman DPS Khanna, on the occasion of Junior Founders Day



Dear Parents, Respected Principal, Mr Mukherjee, the Head Mistress, Mamta Ma'am, Vice Chairperson & Dear Students-

It gives me great pleasure to welcome Sh Dayama Harish Kumar Om Parkash, IPS, SSP Khanna as the Chief Guest on the occasion of XIIth Junior Founders Day.

The Junior School is not only the most vibrant part of the school, it is also the most important facet of the learning process of a child's life. The Government of India has recognised that most learning happens by the age of 8 years. Under the New Education Policy, emphasis is now being laid on early childhood education and on teaching in the language spoken at home.

At DPS Khanna, we are teaching children in a bilingual format. And the mantra is that education should be fun.

So the children learn through puppet shows, songs and dances, games and sports. Emphasis is laid on learning by doing. Kids participating in fancy dress competitions, colouring, making objects out of waste are learning new concepts.

Also through Theme Based Learning, kids are taught about health and wellbeing, manners and etiquettes and moral values. As there is no burden on the mind of the child, Dipsites from Khanna grow up to be confident students and they go on to excel in which ever field they adopt.

This year we started a Play way section in the school where children are admitted when they are 2 years +. The Play way has received a wonderful response. To bring the institution closer to the heart of the city the Play way section will now be shifted into the town. Efforts are being made to find a site where the tiny tots can reach within minutes.



Since a healthy mind resides in a healthy body, students are introduced to sports at an early age. Besides athletics, cricket & football our tiny tots are picking up swimming, horse riding and golf. In the primary school itself our children are winning district level championships. These gifted children will go on to represent the state and the nation. I am sure a star from DPS Khanna will someday go on to win an Olympic Gold for our country.

Here I want to share with you the story of Michael Phelps, the swimmer who has won the largest number of medals in the Olympics. He happened to be at school in Singapore in 2008 on way to the Beijing Olympics. A young student, Joseph Schooling, the best swimmer of the school, requested the Principal to arrange a photo with Phelps as he was the child's idol. Phelps blessed the youngster & in the Rio Olympics in 2016, this kid beat Phelps to win the gold in the 100 m butterfly event.

'Catch them young' is the philosophy of DPS Khanna and we want to work with our ace students, coaches and parents to make the children world famous. The parents will have to look after the sports high achiever's diet and discipline so that each gifted child can achieve his highest potential.

## Shri Dayama Harish Kumar, IPS Senior Superintendent of Police (Khanna) Honourable Chief Guest for Junior Founders Day



Shri Dayama Harish Kumar, IPS, SSP, Khanna graced the occasion of the 12th Junior Founders Day as the Chief Guest. He had a brilliant academic career passing out from St. Stephens, Gujarat and then he earned graduation degree from Delhi University and a Post-Graduation degree from Jamia Millia Islamia University, New Delhi. He joined the Indian Police Services in the year 2014 in J&K Cadre and served in R.S. Pura. After his transfer to Punjab Cadre, his 1st posting as the Assistant Commissioner of Police was at Amritsar. During his tenure, he served as the ADC (Crime) Ludhiana, SP for the Chief Minister's security, SSP in Kapurthala and Bathinda. He joined as an SSP, Khanna in October 2022. The students of DPS Khanna had a tremendous experience, interacting with this great police officer, voracious reader and a marvellous orator too.

### Excerpts from the interview

**Guntaspreet** - What inspired you to choose a career in police services?

**Shri Dayama** - So, when I was a child, I used to be a keen observer. When I used to travel back home, I would observe traffic violators and criminals. So, by observing all this every day, things started to stack up in my mind. It wasn't like that I wanted to be an IPS since childhood but I wanted to be able to do something about all this. So, by working hard and with God's grace I'm an IPS now and I'm thankful for it.

**Gursheen**- What do you like the most about the functioning of this department?

**Shri Dayama** – People should report the matter to the Police so that it can be sorted down in an easy manner before the situation becomes worse. It proves to be a more logical approach since, people do accept their mistake on the sight of a police officer.

**Prabhleen**- Would you please tell us about your schooling?

**Shri Dayama** - I studied at St. Stephen School, Gujarat



**Gursheen-** What made you realize that this was your goal in life?

**Shri Dayama -** While pursuing my career in science, I realized that I wanted to do something which could give me more freedom. Even though, I found research work in the field of science to be very interesting, I just couldn't imagine it as something I would spend my life for.

**Prabhleen-** Who is the most inspiring figure in your life?

**Shri Dayama -** I was inspired by Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam while he was the President of India particularly his quality of doing selfless service is highly motivating. My mother is also a great inspiration as she manages the whole house with utmost devotion and takes care of everyone in the family selflessly.

**Guntaspreet-** Sir, according to you, which qualities one should possess to become a successful person in life?

**Shri Dayama -** According to me, a person should be humble, empathetic and should have a goal in life. Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of our Nation, started the fight for freedom not for himself but for the people of his country.

**Prabhleen-** What do you do to calm yourself in a stressful situation?

**Shri Dayama -** To calm myself, I talk to my wife and myself.

**Gursheen-** Traffic is a huge problem in Khanna. What measures are being taken by your department to solve it?

**Shri Dayama -** I have appointed a Nodal Inspector on Karnail Singh Road who has a good experience of managing traffic. He has always been a big asset in controlling the traffic of Khanna. Signs are being put up on the highway and roads to prevent accidents and give people a better view of the directions.

**Guntaspreet-** In the past few years, the youth of Punjab has become more indulged in drugs. What measures are being taken to curb this menace?

**Shri Dayama -** DAPO Programme had been launched in Punjab. I'd say drugs cannot be considered a personal problem. It is societal problem and the society needs to fight against it together. We should not boycott the person but guide him towards the right direction. There are many factors we need to work upon. We should try to find out....if a person is taking drugs, who provides him with those drugs, where do these drugs come from and how does he get the money to buy them as drugs are too expensive.

We should work out at the grass root level to sort out this problem of grave concern.



## Mr. Narinderpal Singh Aulakh, IPS, Former Director General of Police, Punjab & Director General, National Security Guard Honourable Chief Guest for Senior Founders Day



Mr. Narinderpal Singh Aulakh, IPS, Former Director General of Police, Punjab & Director General, and National Security Guard graced the occasion of the 12th Founders Day as the Chief Guest.

Mr. Aulakh passed out from YPS Patiala and is a Post-Graduate from Punjab University, Chandigarh. He served as a lecturer in the Department of History at Punjab University, Chandigarh, before joining the Indian Police Services. He rendered his services as a Deputy Superintendent of Police, Patiala when militancy was at its peak in Punjab. He was engaged in Counter Militancy Intelligence while posted as a Superintendent of Police (Special Branch) in the Intelligence Department. It is noteworthy that the personnel under Mr. Aulakh's supervision captured the entire leadership of the Jammu & Kashmir Liberation Front (JKLF) when he was on Internal Security Duty as a DIGP, Kashmir in 1989.

As the Inspector General of Police (Investigation), Lokpal Punjab, Mr. Aulakh served under Retired Chief Justice S.S Sodhi of the Punjab and Haryana High Court, investigating various complaints received by the Lokpal. Being the Special Director General, Border Security Force, he held cross border meetings with the Pakistani Rangers to resolve border disputes as well as improving the living conditions of soldiers in forward areas. During his tenure as the Director General of Police, Punjab, he introduced the system of Police Commissionerates in Punjab and enforced the Punjab Police Code ensuring that Punjab was the first state to do so.

Mr. Aulakh as the Director General, National Security Guard, modernized the force by engaging in 'Weapons and Safety Equipment Purchasing Programme' as well as introducing special tactics through interaction with Special Operations Forces from different countries.





Our students had a great experience of interacting with this great police officer whose extensive experience speaks volumes about him.

#### **Excerpts of the Interview**

**Guntaspreet-** Sir, can you please tell us about your education?

**Mr Aulakh-** I completed my schooling from Yadavindra Public School, Patiala. Then I completed Masters in History from Punjab University, Chandigarh.

**Prahleen-** Sir, who is the inspiring figure in your life?

**Mr Aulakh-** My Principal (being very strict) is the inspiring figure in my life. I also give great credit to Mr. Ashwani Kumar (Member of Punjab Legislative Assembly) who is the hero of my life.

**Gursheen-** Sir, as you have served the nation for a very long time, what was the most satisfying part about it?

**Mr. NPS Aulakh-** When I was able to set up a hub in Mumbai by the 30th of June which was the deadline, I felt highly contented. I found it satisfying because I could serve my people and my department. It was a proud moment for me that I was in such a position to keep my word.

**Guntaspreet-** Sir, as you are aware that the youth of Punjab is allured to migrate to foreign lands. What is your message to them?

**Mr. NPS Aulakh-** I suggest that they should go abroad, study, earn money come back and invest in their own country and create more jobs for their countrymen. They must work for the betterment of their country.

**Prahleen-** What do you do to calm yourself in a stressful atmosphere?

**Mr. NPS Aulakh-** I do yoga and meditation which really help us to stay calm. I just close my eyes to remain calm if I am at a public place. It is a good practise and one gets used to it gradually.

**Gursheen-** How did the 26/11 Mumbai attacks affect you as a person and as an officer?

**Mr. NPS Aulakh-** I took over NSG right after the attacks. It was a very difficult time for the people. Everybody was facing an emotional turmoil. The Taj was still in ruins, our team worked really hard continuously for many days to clean everything up. It was a really crucial time for everybody.

**Guntaspreet-** Sir, religious extremism is rising in the country. What do you think is the core reason behind it?

**Mr. NPS Aulakh-** Politics. It is very unfortunate but it is true but we as humans should work towards maintaining peace and harmony amongst all.

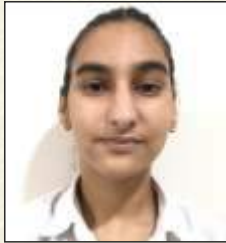

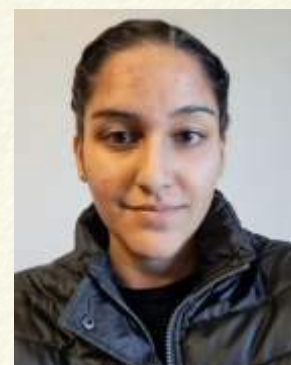
